

Women's Initiatives for Gender Justice



Intern

Application Deadline: 20 January 2019

The Women's Initiatives for Gender Justice is seeking an intern for its office in the Hague. Ideally candidates will be available for six months starting February 2019. The internship will provide an excellent opportunity to gain in-depth knowledge about the work of the Women's Initiatives for Gender Justice and the work of the International Criminal Court (ICC).

Responsibilities

The intern will make an essential contribution to the work of the Legal and Programme Team. The intern will support the Call It What It Is campaign to define sexual violence. Tasks may include:

- Researching issues of sexual violence and international criminal law;
- Attending ICC, civil society and diplomatic meetings, and taking notes to enhance the understanding of the material and brief the team on developments;
- Supporting the Programme Coordinator in planning and implementing campaign events
- Monitoring online survey results and analysing results
- Assisting with the development and organisation of our publications, events and programme work

Eligibility

Applicants should be law students in the final years of their degree or law graduate students with external funding via a grant or scholarship for the whole period of the internship.

Qualifications

Law graduate ideally with a Master's degree, a solid background in international law, strong legal research skills, good writing skills and a sound knowledge of the ICC. The internship requires fluency in written and spoken English; additional French, Russian, Arabic or other language skills are strongly preferred. Applicants should be self-motivated, reliable and organised, with a demonstrated commitment to women's rights and international justice issues. The campaign internship is full-time; however, for exceptional candidates based in The Netherlands, part-time internships may also be possible.

2. Dates of availability. The campaign internship is for a period of 6 months, starting February 2019
3. Details of self-funding
4. One A4-page (about 500 words) explaining why you are interested in the internship. Please include in this letter your connection to gender and women's rights issues as well as a description of your expertise and how that may be of benefit to our work. Please include any other

information you think might be of relevance, e.g., international experience, proficiency in languages other than English and French, experience working for an NGO, etc.

5. Contact information for two references, including one employer; those selected for interviews will also be asked to provide a writing sample. Before sending your application, please carefully review the information on our website (www.4genderjustice.org).

The deadline for applications for the Legal Internship is 20 January 2019. Only short-listed individuals will be invited for an interview. No phone calls, please.
